

Donation Policy for the New Brisbane Library

Developers, landowners, or consultants representing a developer or landowner, who are *currently* applying for a discretionary land use permit (this would include all land use permits but not items such as business license permits or building permits), would not be solicited by the Friends of the Brisbane Library (“Friends”) for a donation for the new Brisbane Library, nor would any such donation be accepted by the Friends if made by the developer, landowner, or consultant. If the developer, landowner, or consultant representing a developer or landowner applied for a land use permit *more than* three years ago from the adoption of the policy, they would have the possibility to have a room/area named after them, and their donation would be accepted by the Friends. If a developer, landowner or consultant applied for a land use permit *less than* three years ago, then they would have the possibility of being recognized on a donor wall and their donation would be accepted by the Friends.

Any business or individual who has a contract with the City of Brisbane (“City”) *in excess of* \$250,000 would not be solicited by the Friends for a donation, nor would any such donation be accepted by the Friends for the new Brisbane Library (this would include businesses with franchises within three years of renewal date). If a business or individual has a contract with the City *below* \$100,000, then they would have the possibility to have a room/area named after them. If a business or individual has a contract with the City *between the amounts of* \$100,000 - \$250,000, they would have the possibility of being recognized on a donor wall and their donation would be accepted by the Friends.
