

Important Fire Flow Improvements to Brisbane's Water Infrastructure Planned for 2018

The City plans to start construction on the **Annis Road PRV Station and Fire Main Replacement Project** in the spring of 2018. This project will provide much-needed improvements to our City's aging drinking water infrastructure and will include the replacement of approximately 6,650 linear feet of 6-inch water main with 8- and 10-inch pipe along portions of Thomas Avenue, Annis Road, Harold Road, Humboldt Road, Sierra Point Road, Kings Road, Margaret Road and Paul Avenue. We will be installing new main line valves, fire hydrants, water services and other infrastructure as well. The work is critically important to upgrade our water distribution system infrastructure to meet current state codes and replace aging pipes.

The project is expected to last 9 months. During construction, the project will require a sequence of full-width road closures within the project area that will present temporary inconveniences to accessing various neighborhoods during the workday. Normal traffic will be resumed at the end of each workday. The project will also require temporary water service disruptions. All impacted residents will be provided advance notice of road closures and water service disruptions.

BRISBANE'S 31ST ANNUAL DAY IN THE PARK & 11TH ANNUAL DERBY



Council Adopts Cannabis Business and Personal Cultivation Ordinance

On September 7th, the City Council adopted Ordinance 617 to regulate certain types of medicinal and non-medicinal cannabis businesses, as well as cultivation of medicinal and non-medicinal cannabis for personal use by adults 21 or older and/or qualified patients on residential properties.

The Ordinance will allow cannabis businesses (including warehousing, distribution, manufacturing, and delivery-only retail) as conditionally permitted uses in the Crocker Industrial Park (TC-1). Research and development involving cannabis will also be

allowed in Crocker Industrial Park, Southwest Bayshore (SCRO-1), and Sierra Point (SP-CRO). The Ordinance will become effective on October 7, 2017.

Planning Commission Recommends Approval of Parkside Plan

At their August 22, 2017 meeting, after conducting two public hearings on the matter, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the Parkside at Brisbane Village Precise Plan (“Parkside Plan”) to the City Council.

Over the two-year planning process to date, nearly 300 Brisbane residents have actively engaged in the Parkside Plan through public workshops, public meetings, Citywide surveys, phone calls, emails, and in person discussions with City staff and plan consultants **MIG**. The Parkside Plan is the culminating document marrying the community’s vision with the City’s obligation to adopt zoning regulations to allow new residential development per the adopted 2015-2022 Housing Element. The Parkside Plan establishes two new overlay zoning districts and building development standards to six properties within Crocker Industrial Park along Park Lane and Park Place identified for future housing development in the City’s Housing Element (shaded in turquoise color in the land use map above). The overlay zoning districts preserve the underlying, existing trade commercial zoning designations of these properties, meaning that the property owners have the option to maintain existing trade commercial uses or redevelop with residential uses consistent with the Plan.

The Parkside Plan also establishes a vision for redeveloping

several commercial properties adjacent to the housing opportunity sites into a vibrant neighborhood commercial center (shaded in rose color in the land use map above).

The City Council will consider adoption of the Plan at a public hearing scheduled for a special meeting date on **Monday, October 16 at 8:00pm** in the Community Room at City Hall (please check the City’s website or call the City Clerk at (415) 508-2110 to confirm the meeting time).

You may also review hard copies of the draft Plan at the Brisbane Library, or at the Community Development Department at City Hall.
