# **Outdoor, Open Spaces and Buildings**

#### **Unmet Needs**

- The small rec center where the old library was located needs updating
- No sidewalks in the hills, hard to get out of the house due to stairs and steep driveways
- Uneven sidewalks due to tree roots
- Some ADA compliance issues have not been addressed or take quite some time to correct

## **Strengths**

- Services are located close together
- Community center at Mission Blue is well kept up
- The marina is a nice place to bike and walk
- Streets are in basically good shape
- Nice level park
- Basketball courts, skateboard park, pool, tennis courts

## **Potential Projects**

- Update the small community center
- Add a Welcome to Brisbane landmark sign

- Inventory uneven sidewalks and prioritize work plan to address the need
- Repaint crosswalks
- Increase tree maintenance
- Add benches throughout the city
- Add signage and a trail map to the trail system on the mountain. Currently, it is not easy to find.
- Add art and workout equipment along the 3-mile industrial loop trail
- Crocker Park trail needs more benches, water stops, lighting, trash cans and restrooms. Also, some businesses throw their garbage in that area. The garbage needs to be more effectively managed.
- Amazon parking lot is a mess with garbage that blows onto trail; the business should have a fence along the trail like most of the other businesses.
- Inventory of ADA issues around town.

# **Transportation**

#### **Unmet Needs**

- Not enough traffic enforcement
- Need more stop signs; flashing lights at crosswalks aren't enough and they are confusing.
- Only one 292 Samtrans line; inconvenient
- Need shuttle to even get people from the hills to the downtown area and to the bus stop on Bayshore
- Uber and Lyft are becoming more expensive

# **Strengths**

 GoGoGrandparents is a good service; you can call the number; don't have to have an app; sends a message to your emergency backup person so they are aware you are taking a ride.

# **Potential Projects**

- Gentle speed bumps to slow people down.
- Improve crosswalk safety at intersections.
- Silverspot Cooperative preschool was identified as a priority area for traffic safety interventions.
- Partner with other cities to offer an affordable shuttle

# **Housing**

#### **Unmet Needs**

- Need more senior housing with parking.
- Expensive to live here even if you own the house. The utilities are too expensive. Social Security is not increasing each year to keep pace with inflation.

## **Strengths**

 ADU's are being built, but they are unaffordable and the majority are not being rented out

## **Potential Projects**

- Dense housing needed by the shopping center area.
- Communicate HIP housing to the community.

# **Social Participation**

#### **Unmet Needs**

• Overall, feel there are good opportunities, but always room for improvement.

## **Strengths**

- Events in the park
- Parks and rec commission
- Agile aging class
- Bingo
- Art classes
- Senior Club

## **Potential Projects**

- Offer more technology classes.
- Help people sign up for SMC alert; get school kids to help with older adults sign up. Partner with the YAC.
- Offer more senior sports, such as pickleball, ping pong, dance classes, other fitness classes, yoga clases.
- Bocce Ball
- Community Game Night and/or Comedy night
- Community Potluck at the parks
- Create a co-operative that sells/swaps smaller portions of food; could meet at the park on a quarterly basis. It offers an opportunity to meet people and learn about each other's food likes.

# Social Isolation and Respect

#### **Unmet Needs**

Aging is not prioritized

## **Strengths**

- Brisbane Helping Hands is a wonderful organization; offer companionship to homebound people, grocery shopping, yard work, driving, technology help, going for walks.
- Being a small town, people seem to be more respectful since most people know each other.
- Preschool now occasionally comes to the Sunrise room to be read to by the older adults.
- Older adults' opinions are encouraged to be vocalized.

# **Potential Projects**

- Advertise volunteer opportunities in the schools.
- Offer more intergenerational activities, e.g., through Parks and Rec
- Promote age friendly businesses.
  - For example, if a host/hostess sees people struggling to get inside the restaurant, they should help and keep the door open.
  - Menus should have larger font and have a "senior" selection that offers "smaller portions" at a lower rate than the normal portion.

# **Communication/Information**

## **Unmet Needs**

 Many seniors aren't familiar with technology and not up to date with communication.

## **Strengths**

- The Blast
- The Star
- Luminary
- All commission meetings and city council meetings are televised
- Communications officer

## **Potential Projects**

- Spotlight Helping Hands in the Blast and The Star so people understand what they do and offer
- Develop a Senior Newsletter and send it out 2-4 times a year
- Mail out the activity guide; it is currently only available online

- Use voter registration as a mailing target for a senior newsletter.
- Distribute flyers at the library

# **Civic Participation and Employment**

#### **Unmet Needs**

• Don't know of employment opportunities.

# **Strengths**

- Plenty of opportunities to apply for a commission.
- Also have ample opportunity to voice opinion at council meetings.

# **Potential Projects**

- Create a bulletin board in the library with job opportunities
- Develop an Age Friendly Senior Commission

# **Community Health Services**

#### **Unmet Needs**

Lack of awareness about resources for older adults

## **Strengths**

# **Potential Solutions**

- A resource person that people can call to ask questions or ask for help.
- Distribute Help at Home booklets
  - Brisbane Helping Hand volunteers could hand out the booklet to the community members they already interact with.
- Resource/ health fair
  - Offer transportation and food to attract people to the event.
